Topic:

Our Topic is Castles and Battles.

As part of our Autumn Topic we will be learning all about castles, who lived there, the royal family and about famous battles in History. We will be making some fantastic art work using techniques such sand layering, collaging, sketching and using pastels. We will even be visiting Nottingham's very own castle in the city centre!

Our targets are:

English work this half term:

Mathematics work this half term:

In Maths at the moment, we are working on our place value and our four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).

Our targets are:

- I can count in my multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s
- I can partition a number into tens and ones
- I can add a 2 digit number in a column
- I can subtract a 2 digit number in a column
- I can multiply by 2, 5 and 10
- I can divide by 2, 5 and 10

To give your child a head start for next term, you can work together at home to practise telling the time to quarter past, half past, quarter to and o'clock.
